

INTRODUCTION

Nestled on 3 pristine acres along the serene Wilson Creek, 17450 Wilson Creek Road offers an unparalleled blend of rustic elegance and modern luxury. This estate boasts a 2,583 sq ft primary residence complemented by a spacious 1,245 sq ft heated garage and shop with 220 hookups, a 950 sq ft accessory dwelling unit (ADU) above the garage, and a 975 sq ft guest house. The main residence features three bedrooms (two en-suite), 2.5 bathrooms, a study, and a mudroom. Craftsmanship shines with wood beams, vaulted ceilings, tongue-and-groove ceilings, and oil-finished white oak flooring designed for radiant heat. The kitchen is a chef's dream, showcasing quartz countertops, a gas range, GE refrigerator, and porcelain tile in bathrooms inspired by a famed 1896 design, paired with vintage marble countertops. Artisan Aaron Jacobs' solid walnut and oak cabinetry, doors, and accents add bespoke charm throughout. Additional amenities include a gas fireplace, coffee and dry bars, a large butlers pantry, John Louis closet systems, hand-forged iron cabinet pulls, geothermal heating and cooling, a large generator, instant hot water, radon mitigation system, crawl space access in the garage, Graber blinds, Anderson windows, and an ERV air filtration system. The private ADU attached to the main house offers one bedroom, one bathroom, a large living room/dining area and a kitchenette, providing comfort and privacy for guests or extended family. The guest house, currently generating \$65K annually as an Airbnb, serves as a lucrative income opportunity or additional accommodation. Outdoor living is equally impressive with two brand-new fire safety-compliant bridges constructed of concrete and steel, 500 feet of Wilson Creek frontage with a swimming hole, a walking trail with a bridge over the creek, cedar split rail fencing, a patio by the creek with a fire pit, a large garden with water access, an 8x16 equipment barn, trailer/RV parking, a large chicken coop, a 12x20 shed, and an 8x10 greenhouse. The property is further enhanced by no zoning or covenants, two new dosing septic systems, three wells (two for geothermal), a 1,000-gallon underground propane tank, and underground sprinklers. This exceptional estate seamlessly combines artisanal craftsmanship, modern amenities, and natural beauty, offering a unique and luxurious Montana living experience.



Bozeman lifestyle is considered one of the most appealing in the West. GALLATIN COUNTY

Located in a sweeping valley in the heart of the Rocky Mountains, Gallatin County is the most populated and fastest growing county in scenic southwest Montana. Gallatin Valley has a rich history. Native americans referred to this area as the "Valley of Flowers". The name seems appropriate because of the great variety of wild flowers found on the mountainsides as well as in the valley. Gallatin Valley derives its name from the Gallatin River, one of the forks of the Missouri river that rises in Yellowstone Park. The Gallatin river, Jefferson river, and



Madison river all merge at the town of Three Forks to form the Missouri River. Lewis and Clark named the rivers on their famous expedition to this part of the world in 1805.



There are approximately 1,682,048 acres(2,500 square miles) in Gallatin County including over 16,500 acres in surface water. Approximately 800,000 acres in Gallatin County are owned by the public and managed by several local and national agencies including the Bureau of Land Management, U.S. Forest Service, National Park Service, Montana Fish Wildlife & Parks, Montana Department of Transportation, Department of Natural Resources & Conservation and various local governments. The U.S. Forest Service is the largest land holder in Gallatin

County, currently managing over 665,000 acres. In addition to the Forest Service, various state departments manage approximately 61,000 acres. The Bureau of Land Management holds just over 9,000 acres and an additional 1,600 acres belongs to local governments. On the southern edge of Gallatin County is Yellowstone National Park. Yellowstone National Park is one of the world's primary wildlife preserves and has the greatest concentration of geysers and hot springs in America. Yellowstone National Park is 2,219,789 acres in size(Larger than Rhode Island and Delaware combined). Over 97,600 acres of Yellowstone National Park is located within Gallatin County.
