INTRODUCTION

Situated in the heart of prestigious Bridger Canyon, this stunning home sits on nearly 26 acres just ~6 miles from Bozeman. Offering some of the most striking views in the area, the property captures the best of Montana livingsweeping Bridger Range vistas, abundant wildlife, and access to world-class recreation including Bridger Bowl Ski Area, hiking trails, and Gallatin National Forest. The private setting is conveniently close to town, ideal for those seeking a rural lifestyle with modern convenience. Bridger Bowl is ~11 miles up the canyon and the M Hiking Trail is just ~4 miles toward town. Built in 1992 with expansion in 2002, the home is designed for comfortable daily living. A dramatic wall of windows in the great room flood the interior with natural light and frame the ever-present scenery. Every bedroom opens directly to the outdoors through exterior doors, creating a seamless indoor-outdoor connection that defines the property's appeal. A two-level deck (new 3 years ago), porch, and patio provide choices for morning coffee, evening relaxation, or entertaining while soaking in the scenery. The landscaped yard features a rock-bordered gathering area ideal for a fire pit. Two garages and a generous parking area offer space for guests, campers, boats, or other toys. The living room features a gas fireplace framed by built-in cabinetry, while the adjacent dining area sits beside the expansive windows. The kitchen is a gourmet hub with a high-end Frigidaire Gallery range & refrigerator, wine fridge, and pantry. A custom bar top was crafted from a plank salvaged from a sunken Lake Michigan steamboat adding historic flair. The primary bedroom has vaulted ceilings, large windows, and a door to a seating area on the deck perfect for mountain gazing. The primary bathroom features a tiled shower, dual vanities, plus an additional vanity nook. A basement family room and den provide areas for relaxation with two sets of stairs (one at each end of the home) including a striking spiral staircase. The detached garage features a heated studio space, perfect for painting, woodworking, fly-tying, ski tuning, or other hobbies, opening into a screened-in sunroom. Perfectly suited to the Bridger Canyon lifestyle, the design celebrates the outdoors whether inside or out. The combination of thoughtful features, generous storage, and unmatched natural beauty makes this property a rare find in one of Bozeman's most desirable areas.

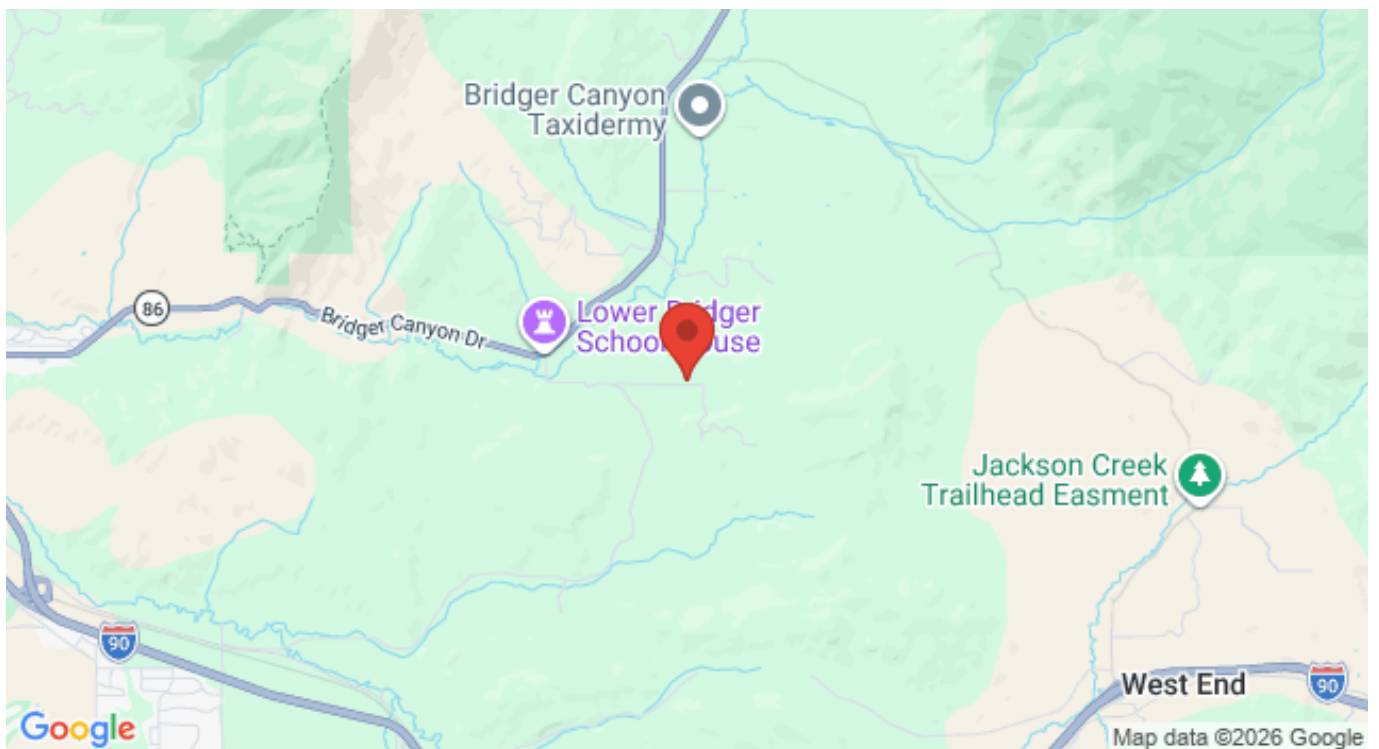

Bozeman lifestyle is considered one of the most appealing in the West. 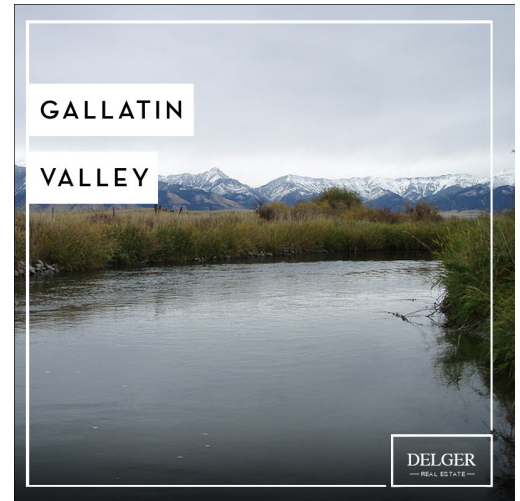
When it comes to outdoor recreation Bozeman is surrounded by 6 different mountain ranges, which offer vast winter and summer recreational opportunities.

A world class destination for fly fishing, Bozeman is home to the world's most famous Blue Ribbon fly fishing rivers, spring creeks and lakes on Earth. The Yellowstone, Madison, Gallatin, Jefferson, Beaverhead, and Missouri rivers are all nearby.

Bozeman has 60 miles of "Main Street To Mountains" trail system in town, surrounded by 6.9 million acres of public land.

GALLATIN COUNTY

Located in a sweeping valley in the heart of the Rocky Mountains, Gallatin County is the most populated and fastest growing county in scenic southwest Montana. Gallatin Valley has a rich history. Native Americans referred to this area as the "Valley of Flowers". The name seems appropriate because of the great variety of wild flowers found on the mountainsides as well as in the valley. Gallatin Valley derives its name from the Gallatin River, one of the forks of the Missouri river that rises in Yellowstone Park. The Gallatin river, Jefferson river, and Madison river all merge at the town of Three Forks to form the Missouri River. Lewis and Clark named the rivers on their famous expedition to this part of the world in 1805.



There are approximately 1,682,048 acres (2,500 square miles) in Gallatin County including over 16,500 acres in surface water. Approximately 800,000 acres in Gallatin County are owned by the public and managed by several local and national agencies including the Bureau of Land Management, U.S. Forest Service, National Park Service, Montana Fish Wildlife & Parks, Montana Department of Transportation, Department of Natural Resources & Conservation and various local governments. The U.S. Forest Service is the largest land holder in Gallatin

County, currently managing over 665,000 acres. In addition to the Forest Service, various state departments manage approximately 61,000 acres. The Bureau of Land Management holds just over 9,000 acres and an additional 1,600 acres belongs to local governments. On the southern edge of Gallatin County is Yellowstone National Park. Yellowstone National Park is one of the world's primary wildlife preserves and has the greatest concentration of geysers and hot springs in America. Yellowstone National Park is 2,219,789 acres in size (Larger than Rhode Island and Delaware combined). Over 97,600 acres of Yellowstone National Park is located within Gallatin County.
